

SEASCAPE CERT- NEIGHBOR BULLETIN #2 EMERGENCY SUPPLIES FOR YOUR HOME

Contact

Arrange for all members of your household to call the same person out of state on the day of the disaster to report your condition, location, and plans.

Food for Humans and Pets

Store one gallon of water per person per day for a three to five day supply in plastic containers. Store at least a three-day supply per person of non-perishable food that requires no refrigeration, cooking, and little water. Include a mechanical can opener. If you have pets, include a three day supply of pet food, extra water, 3-day supply of any needed pet medications, a pet blanket.

First Aid Kit

Standard first aid kit for your home and car. Include sun screen, latex gloves, aspirin, laxatives, prescription medication, sun glasses, extra prescription glasses, contact lenses, and supplies.

Clothing and Bedding

Store heavy-duty clothing for each family member like long-sleeved heavy shirt and jacket, heavy pants, socks, sturdy shoes, sturdy gloves, and enough blankets to cover everyone.

Emergency Supplies- Purchase a Preparedness Kit at www.redcross.org

Flashlight, battery-operated radio (extra batteries), utility knife, fire extinguisher, pliers, tape, matches (waterproof container), colored chalk (for writing emergency messages on your house or garage door),shut-off wrench to turn off household gas and water, whistle, cash, and cellular phone. Put your Seascape CERT House Disaster Survey on your refrigerator for easy access.

Sanitation & Hygiene

Toilet paper, wipes, paper towel roll, liquid antibacterial soap, feminine supplies, deodorant, plastic garbage bags and ties, plastic bucket with tight lid, disinfectant, tooth brush and paste.

Important Family Documents (make copies now to store)

Keep records in a waterproof, portable container or a safety deposit box: Records include: your will, insurance policies, contracts deeds, stocks and bonds, passports, social security cards, immunization records, bank account and credit card account numbers, inventory of household items, telephone numbers, and family records (birth, marriage, death certificates). Store in a place known to trusted family members or friends.
